## RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

## **APRIL 2, 2024**

The Richland County Board of Commissioners met on April 2, 2024 with Commissioners Nathan Berseth, Tim Campbell, Rollie Ehlert, Terry Goerger and Perry Miller. Others included Administration Personnel Fossum and DelVal; State's Attorney Kummer, a Daily News Reporter and visitor Candice Jeanotte.

A motion was made by Campbell and seconded by Goerger to approve the Agenda. Vote was unanimous.

A motion was made by Ehlert and seconded by Campbell to <u>approve the Minutes of</u> <u>meetings March 5 and March 19.</u> Vote was unanimous.

# TREASURERS REPORT

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Goerger to approve the Treasurer's Report. Vote was unanimous.

#### HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Highway Personnel included Engineer Sedler and Donnie Witt.

<u>CR 22 Drain Tile -</u> Bids were opened at the March 19 Commission Meeting. Traxler Construction of LeCenter MN was the low bidder.

A motion was made by Goerger and seconded by Campbell to award the bid to Traxler Construction. Voting NO was Berseth the remainder voted Yes and the motion carried. Berseth commented that Ellingson Drainage was local and he would like them to be given an opportunity for the project.

Sedler gave an update on Highway activities:

- CR 16 project will be awarded at the April 16 meeting
- Ice Slicer is a de-icer product we will try next year, may consider a hoop shelter
- Crews will begin four-ten hour shifts next week
- Crews will be assisting the Extension Office with relocating for the HVAC Project
- B Roads there will be a sign up sheet at the Township Officers meeting for affected Townships to set up a time to meet with Commissioners and Highway personnel

#### JOHN ANDERSON - HVAC PROJECT UPDATE

Anderson reported the project is moving along, ceilings will be installed in the Highway and Water Resource offices next week and they should be able to move back into their offices shortly after that; Extension and Emergency Management will begin moving from their offices today and tomorrow for the next phase of the project.

The original Court Room blueprints show a Leaded Art Glass Skylight. Anderson would like to pursue exposing it when the roofing project takes place. Miller suggested talking to the roofer to determine what would be the easiest way to determine if the skylight is still under the dome.

In other business, Anderson reported the only option for an appraisal of the historical painting that was in the Commission Room, may be to take it to Minneapolis. Ehlert recommended it be kept safe during the HVAC Project and then it be hung back in the Commission Room.
