RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OCTOBER 7, 2025

The Richland County Board of Commissioners met at 8:00 A.M. October 7, 2025 at the Richland County Courthouse with Commissioners Tim Campbell, Terry Goerger, Nathan Berseth, Rollie Ehlert, and Perry Miller. Others included Administrative Personnel Fossum and South, State's Attorney Kummer, Jesse Sedler, Donnie Witt, John Anderson, Sarah Erickson, Melissa Brown, Ronda Gripentrog, Lacy Christopher, Deb Evenson, Cindy Zick, and Mary Sahl.

Commissioner Campbell called the meeting to order. A motion was made by Goerger and seconded by Miller to approve the agenda. Vote was unanimous.

A motion was made by Ehlert and seconded by Miller to approve the minutes of meetings September 2 and September 16. Vote was unanimous.

TREASURERS REPORT

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Miller <u>to approve the Treasurer's Report.</u> Vote was unanimous.

MINIMUM SALE PRICE HEARING

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Ehlert to approve the minimum sale prices as presented for foreclosure properties. Vote was unanimous. (Copy attached).

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mary Sahl addressed the Commission with questions regarding an industrial ag grant that was approved for Riverview Dairy. Sahl was referred to the State Ag Commissioner.

Commissioner Berseth informed Sahl that the Richland County Board of Commissioners have had zero votes regarding the approval of Riverview Dairy.

EXTENSION - STAFFING

County Extension Agents Lacy Christopher and Ronda Gripentrog addressed the Commission with a staffing proposal they created in preparation of an upcoming retirement within their department. Gripentrog explained that there would be a one-month overlap in salaries with the proposed plan, but that expense would be offset in the first year and the department would have a net savings of more than \$15,000 annually after 2026. A

motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Goerger to approve a one-month overlap of salaries for the Extension Office in 2026. Vote was unanimous.

MISC/CORRESPONDENCE

Fossum informed the Commission that the Board of Health has a board term that is expiring in October. One letter of interest has been received from Lance Ehrlin, the current board member. A motion was made by Ehlert and seconded by Goerger to appoint Lance Ehrlin to another term on the Richland County Board of Health. Vote was unanimous.

Correspondence from ND Water Users Association – Annual Joint Convention is December 9-11 in Bismarck.

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Ehlert <u>to appoint Terry Goerger and Ronda</u> <u>Gripentrog as delegates to the ND State Fair</u>. Vote was unanimous.

Correspondence from Court Facilities Improvement Advisory Committee – Grant applications are due December 31, 2025.

MELISSA BROWN - STATE EQUALIZATION RECOMMENDATION

Tax Director Melissa Brown informed the Commission that the State Board of Equalization meeting for appeals was held October 2nd. The ag land values in Walcott West Township had been protested; Richland County was found to be in compliance. Brown reported that the State Board of Equalization did come back with the following recommendation: the Richland County Commissioners should consider exploring a different PI formula when assessing agricultural land.

A new soils committee was discussed; Brown will reach out to potential committee members.

HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT

Highway personnel in attendance were Jesse Sedler and Donnie Witt. Sedler gave the following updates regarding Highway activity:

- -traffic study near Christine is not quite complete
- -graveling is almost complete, spot graveling a few areas
- -all major projects are complete
- -Flex Funding Grant application was submitted for CR1, grants will be awarded 12/31/25
- -CR16 was repainted west of I-29

Bridge Flex Funding Grant application was discussed.

Commissioner Goerger shared a letter of thanks addressed to the Commission and Highway Department.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- A) HSZ Board Board met in Milnor two weeks ago. Mary Schradick retired from the board; Valerie Nelson was appointed to a new term.
- B) Buildings & Grounds Drain tile project for the Courthouse started Monday, should take approximately one month to complete. Landscaping will be done in the spring to allow for settling. New trees will be planted on the boulevard.
- C) Public Health Board met last week.
- D) JDA/JPA JDA should be meeting in two weeks.
- E) Weed Board Contract spraying is complete. The Landowner Assistance Program will be worked on in the next month. Furnace has been installed. Next meeting is in November.
- F) Soils Committee A new committee was discussed earlier in the meeting.
- G) Park Board Board met in September. Commissioner Ehlert will meet Steve at Mooreton Pond next week to determine where rock needs to be added.
- H) Administration Fossum informed the Commission that the 2024 audit is complete.
