ROGER JENSEN - HISTORIC PAINTING IN COMMISSION ROOM

Berseth asked Jensen if he would be willing to take the lead into researching the restoration process. Jensen agreed to look into the process.

A motion was made by Miller and seconded by Campbell to <u>approve a Raffle Permit Application for the Richland Lutheran Church</u>. Vote was unanimous.

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Miller to <u>approve the cost for continuing ed for Auditor Fossum for Tax Director Certification</u>. Vote was unanimous.

Fossum reported it will be Richland County's turn to <u>host the next 5-County</u> <u>meeting</u>. The consensus of the Board was to wait until 2024.
