# RICHLAND COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS NOVEMBER 7, 2023

The Richland County Board of Commissioners met on November 7, 2023 with Commissioners Nathan Berseth, Tim Campbell, Rollie Ehlert, Terry Goerger and Perry Miller. Others included Administration Personnel Fossum and DelVal; State's Attorney Kummer; Assistant State's Attorney Rydell and a Daily News Reporter.

A motion was made by Goerger and seconded by Miller to <u>approve the Agenda</u>. Vote was unanimous.

A motion was made by Goerger and seconded by Campbell to <u>approve the Minutes of meetings October 3 and October 17.</u> Vote was unanimous.

### TREASURERS REPORT

A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Goerger to <u>approve the Treasurer's Report</u>. Vote was unanimous.

#### SHERIFF RUHL - DEPARTMENT REPORT

Ruhl distributed a department report to the Commission and reported in a two-month period they had 1,461 calls for service including saturation patrol, serving papers, domestic calls and assisting other agencies.

Ruhl requested authorization to purchase scheduling software for the Jail. A motion was made by Berseth and seconded by Campbell to <u>authorize an expenditure from the Commissary Funds to purchase Scheduling Software for the Jail. Vote was unanimous.</u>

## **HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT**

Engineer Sedler gave a brief update on Highway activities:

- The Helping Hands 4-H Club would like to "Adopt a Highway" cleaning a stretch of Road on Hwy 81North from Hwy 13.
  The Board voiced no objections to the request.
- <u>Eagle Twsp Bridge</u> Progress is being made, the South embunkment should be poured this week.

Wolfe Crossing - The crossing is passable, finish work will be done next Spring.

Commissioner Goerger asked about forming a <u>Long Range Road Committee</u>. Discussion followed and included:

- Township participation
- funding
- traffic counts
- review of which are County Roads and which are Township Roads
- educating Townships on funding and getting citizens involved

The consensus was to ask for volunteers at the Fall Township Officers Meeting and to map and do traffic counts next summer and compile additional data; Berseth will also have an illustration of numbers to present at the Township Officers meeting along with information on the cost for projects.

- B) Buildings & Grounds -A Construction walkthrough for the HVAC Project will be done mid-December, the project will begin in February. THE FFA Bench will be installed this week.
- C) Public Health Andrew Wildeman reported and distributed information on vaccinations and immunizations offered through the Health Department. The Department has given over 450 covid and flu vaccinations; every Friday they offer walk-in clinics; they also have outreach clinics.
  - Kayla Carlson briefly reported on the contract with NDSCS, the Health Department Services are offered on Campus Mondays and Thursdays from 10-2.
- D) JDA/JPA Several possible loans next month. 5-6 homes sold in the last few weeks. The Housing Summit has been moved to December 6 at 6 PM.

- G) Park Board No report.
- H) Administration Polling locations for next years elections need to be set by year end. The Auditors are close to finishing up the Annual Audit.
